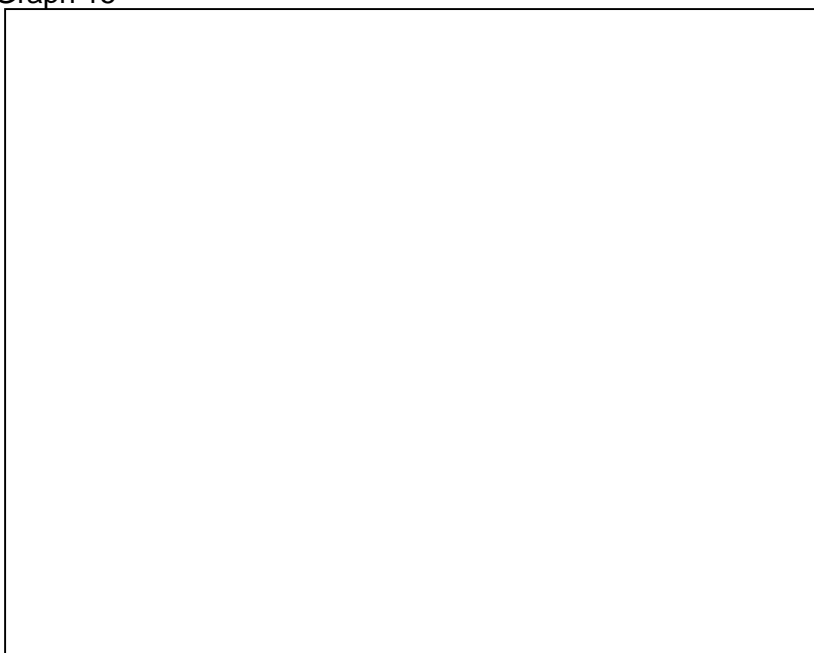


## LEVELS OF CAR OWNERSHIP

Graph 15, taken from the Waltham Forest Workplace Report, shows distance travelled to work by the workforce in Waltham Forest. The distance travelled to work is calculated as a straight line between the postcode of residence and the postcode of the workplace.

The graph shows that the majority of the workers that work in Waltham Forest travel less than 5 kilometres to their workplace (60%); this includes the 35,000 residents who live and work in the Borough. In addition 11% of the workplace population work at or from home, 6,740 people.

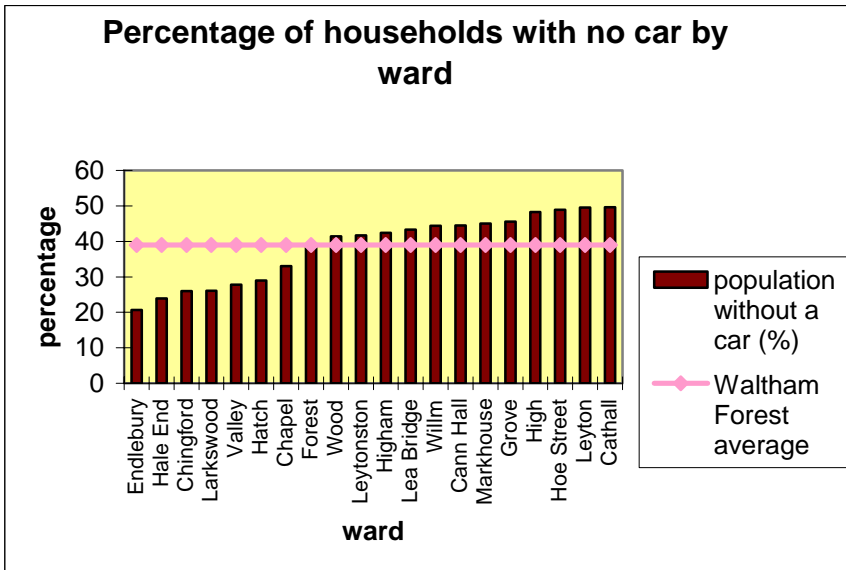
The Census 2001 data show that 27.5% of the working population of Waltham Forest travel to work by Underground and light rail. This will mainly be those who work outside the borough in Central London, especially the City of London, as there are good links into London with the Victoria line, Central line and main line trains into Liverpool Street Station. 32.9% of the working population travel to work by car or van.

As Graph 16 below shows, households in the south of the borough are less likely to have a car than in the north of the borough. This is in keeping with the findings from the 1991 Census data, however the percentage of non car holders in the south of the borough has increased since the last Census data from 35% in Cathall and Leyton in 1991 to around 50% in 2001.

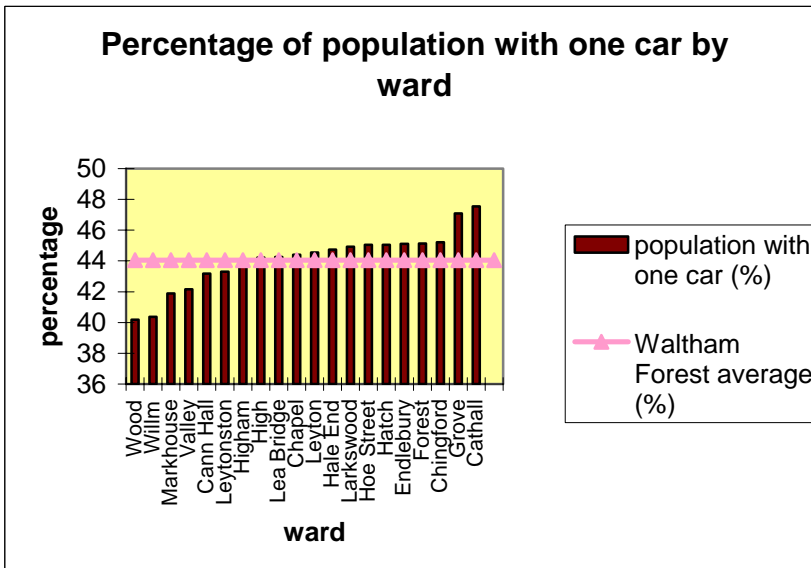

The travel method of residents working outside Waltham Forest, again from the Waltham Forest workplace report, shows the Underground, train or bus as being more frequently used by workers leaving the Borough than by those working within Waltham Forest. 61% of residents working outside Waltham Forest use public transport. 38,340 people use public transport to travel to work outside the Borough. The car is the method of travel for over 20,000 workers. 34% of outflow workers drive or are passengers in a car or van, which is 21,550 people.
