Notice of adoption of a Development Plan Document**

Waltham Forest Local Plan – Blackhorse Lane Area Action Plan

In accordance with Regulation 26 and Regulation 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, notice is hereby given that Waltham Forest Council adopted the Blackhorse Lane Area Action Plan as a Development Plan Document on 29th January 2015.

The Blackhorse Lane Area Action Plan is a key planning document which forms part of the Council's Local Plan and sets out the long term spatial vision and strategy for delivering the growth and regeneration of the area to 2026.

On the 15th January 2013, Cabinet resolved to publish the Proposed Submission Blackhorse Lane Area Action Plan for statutory consultation and submission to the Secretary of State for independent examination. The Area Action Plan was submitted on 28th February 2014. The Examination in Public was conducted by Mr Peter Drew BSc (HONS) DIPTP, MRTPI. The Inspector's Report, with its recommendations, was received by the Council on 14th October 2014 and is published on the Council's website. The adopted Blackhorse Lane Area Action Plan includes the Inspector's recommendations.

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the Blackhorse Lane Area Action Plan may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate powers and/or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made no later than the end of the six week period from the date of adoption (i.e. 12th March 2015).
