Dear Resident or Stakeholder,

Have your say on the future development of Waltham Forest

Waltham Forest has a real opportunity to improve for the better. The regeneration that is happening throughout East London can bring new and exciting opportunities to the residents and businesses of Waltham Forest. However, to take full advantage of this, we need to plan the Borough in a way that will maximise the benefits for everyone.

To take this forward, the Council is seeking feedback on a plan that sets out how the Council will manage and plan for change and development over the next 15 years. The plan is called the **Local Development Framework Core Strategy Preferred Options** document. This new plan deals with the most significant planning issues facing Waltham Forest. Planning affects many aspects of our lives: from where we can live, to where we can work, to where and how we can enjoy ourselves. So it is important that we get it right.

Evidence shows that people living in East London, which includes Waltham Forest, earn less money, have fewer qualifications and tend to lead less healthy lifestyles than people living in other parts of London. To change this, the key aim of our plan is to make sure that people living and working in Waltham Forest have the same life opportunities and experiences as the rest of London. To do this, the plan proposes policies that will bring better quality housing at prices local people can afford, create new, well paid jobs, and create an environment that will be attractive and green making Waltham Forest the sort of place that people will want to live in for years to come.

Our plan is now out for public consultation. It sets out the Council's preferred policy options for creating a better Waltham Forest. These options have been proposed after listening to the previous comments of local people, businesses and government agencies at earlier stages in the plan's preparation. The document is published with other related documents including Sustainability Appraisal and Equality Impact Assessment.

The Council really wants to hear your opinion on this very important document and whether or not you agree with the Council's suggested policy approach. Consultation on the Core Strategy Preferred Options will run from **Monday 11 January 2010 to Friday 19 February 2010**.
