VISITOR PERMIT ELIGIBILITY FOR RESIDENTS OF NEW BUILD PROPERTIES IN THE 'WSC' CONTROLLED PARKING ZONE (CPZs) (T13(23))

The Waltham Forest (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. x) Order 2023

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest (the 'Council') propose to make the above-mentioned Order under section 45 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
2. The general effect of the Order would be to allow residents of a new development within the WSC CPZ mentioned below to purchase permits to allow their visitors to park within that CPZ (general permits for permanent parking on-street for residents are not permitted under agreed planning conditions for the new properties):
 - (a) Nos. 1 to 19, Eastfield house, 15a Eastfield Road, London, E17 3DZ (properties situated within the **WSC CPZ**); and
 - (b) Residents of all properties above will be eligible for visitor permits to park in the CPZ surrounding their property (terms and conditions apply).
3. Residents' visitor permits will be obtainable as paperless permits or as scratch-cards at a rate of 70p/hour. For more information regarding permits for e.g., a **tradespersons** permit, which may be applied for by residents on the behalf of tradespersons engaged in work at their home address within the CPZ, visit: <https://www.walthamforest.gov.uk/service-categories/parking-permits>. Any charges mentioned therein may be subject to change.
4. A copy of each of the Orders, the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders and plans showing the locations and effect of the Orders **can be inspected** until the end of a period of 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, the Council decides not to make the Orders, on request by either emailing traffic.scheme@walthamforest.gov.uk, or visiting (*by appointment) the Highways, Low Hall, Argall Avenue E10 7AS during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive; or alternatively documents can be viewed online at: www.walthamforest.gov.uk/content/road-traffic-schemes-and-consultations.
5. Any person desiring to object to the proposals should send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to; Traffic Orders, Highways and Traffic Management, Low Hall, Argall Avenue, London, E10 7AS, or by emailing: ***traffic.scheme@walthamforest.gov.uk*** quoting scheme reference ***T13(23) – visitor permit eligibility of new build properties in the WSC cpz*** by the end of a period of 21 days from the date on which this Notice is published. All objections must specify the grounds on which they are made.
