NO-ENTRY, WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTIONS AMENDMENTS, ONE-WAY TO VEHICULAR TRAFFIC (EXCEPT CYCLES), CONTRAFLOW CYCLING, SUSPENSION OF SHORT STAY PARKING

The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (Station Road E17) (No.1) Traffic Order 2023, The Waltham Forest (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 184) Order 2023 The Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 183) Order 2023

- NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest (the Council) on 20th July 2023 made the above-mentioned Traffic Orders under sections 6, 45 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders will be to continue indefinitely the provisions of: The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (Station Road E17) (No.1) Experimental Traffic Order 2022, The Waltham Forest (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 112) Experimental Order 2022, The Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 112) Experimental Order 2022, which by way of an experiment, in Station Road (STN) (section between St James Street and Lynmouth Road):
 - (a) prohibited motor vehicles (including motorcycles) (except pedal cycles) travelling in Station Road between Markhouse Avenue and Lynmouth Road from proceeding in Station Road north of the northern kerb line of Lynmouth Road where entry to that section of Station Road north of Lynmouth Road is prohibited by a 'noentry' sign plate;
 - (b) west side suspended all short stay parking outside Nos. 2 to 6 Station Road;
 - (c) both sides provided double yellow line "at any time" waiting and loading restrictions; and
 - (d) prohibited motor vehicles (except cyclists) from proceeding at any time in any direction other than from north to south.

More specific details of the above-mentioned provisions are contained in the notice of making of the original experimental traffic orders advertised in the Waltham Forest News edition No. 243 dated 28th January 2022.

- 3. Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation from 20th July 2023 and all other relevant documents can be inspected until the expiration of a period of 6 weeks from that date on request by either emailing <u>traffic.scheme@walthamforest.gov.uk</u> or visiting (*by appointment) the Highways and Traffic Management office, Low Hall. Any person desiring to question the validity of either of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the making of the Orders, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
