This project is registered under the Considerate Constructors Scheme. This is a voluntary scheme which is designed to encourage best practice beyond the statutory requirements. It is part of our commitment to achieve the highest standards of health and safety whilst respecting your local community and environment.



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Our work on site commenced in early July and has progressed significantly since then. We have completed the excavation of the building footprint and have also finished all piling works associated with the new foundations of the building.

In the coming months, works will include further ground works to get the foundations ready for the installation of the building. Additionally, we will be installing the traditional steel framework for the new sports hall, as well as works on the drainage systems and electricity connections.

Deliveries have been carefully planned in close collaboration with the relevant authorities to minimise impact on residents and businesses. Works have been planned and programmed for weekdays, however there may be times when we need to work on site during the weekend period or into the evenings. This will be kept to a minimum and within any local planning regulations.
