The Waltham Forest (Pedestrian and Cycle Zone) (Event Days) (Prescribed Routes) (No. 1) Traffic Order 2023

Made 11th December 2023

Coming into force 11th December 2023

The Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended and all other powers enabling, hereby makes the following Order:-

Citation, commencement and expiry

This Order may be cited as The Waltham Forest (Pedestrian and Cycle Zone) (Event Days) (Prescribed Routes) (No. 1) Traffic Order 2023, shall come into force on 11th December 2023.

Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order:

> "bus" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Traffic Signs Regulation and General Directions 2016(a)

"cause" or "causing" includes permit or permitting;

"carriageway" has the same meaning as in section 329(1) of the Highways Act 1980¹;

"disabled person's badge" and "disabled person's badge holder" have the same meaning as in Regulation 2 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000²;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment:

"event day" means any day on which a football match or other event is being held at Leyton Orient Football Club's Brisbane Road Stadium, Brisbane Road, Leyton,

any such football match being one which appears in either the Leyton Orient Football Club's Official Fixture List or other promotional bulletin and which is to have an expected attendance of 2,000 persons or more, not including any staff or contractors engaged in either the operation or management of the aforementioned Stadium or event.

"Event Day commander" means the Senior Officer of the Metropolitan Police Service appointed as the principal co-ordinator of policing and traffic management activities within the Leyton orient Football Club's Traffic Management Zone on an Event Day:

"the Council" means the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest.

"motor vehicle" has the same meaning as is mentioned in section 136(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

"pedestrian and cycle zone" means a road or length of road specified in column (2) of a table;

"permit holder":-

- (a) has the same meaning as mentioned in Article 3 of The Waltham Forest (Charged For Parking Places) Order 2019(a);
- (b) means a person who has satisfied the Council that their main place of residence, employment, business or organisation is located at premises the postal address of which is specified:
 - (i) in column (4) of item 1 of the table in Schedule 1 in relation to that pedestrian and cycle zone, in respect of whose vehicle a permit with a specific permit identifier specified in column (5) of item 1 of the table in Schedule 1 to enter that pedestrian and cycle zone during the prescribed hours, has been granted;
 - (ii) Unused;

and the permit identifier, if identified on that form of permit, is also identified on a traffic sign relating to the pedestrian and cycle

or

a disabled person's badge holder who has satisfied the Council that they
have a bona fide reason for entering that pedestrian and cycle zone during
the prescribed hours, and in respect of that vehicle a disabled persons badge
is displayed;

"permit identifier" has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Traffic Signs Regulation and General Directions 2016;

"prescribed hours" means, in respect of a pedestrian and cycle zone operating during an event day, the periods specified in column (3) of a table in relation to that pedestrian and cycle zone;

"prescribed street" means a street, road or length thereof referred to in Article 3 or in a Schedule;

"proof of address" means either a valid driver's licence, or a utility bill or a Council Tax bill dated within 3 months of an event day, or a bank statement dated within 3 months of an Event Day, issued in respect of a person residing at an address within a prescribed street;

"public maintainable highway" has the same meaning as in section 36 of the Highways Act 1980;

"the Order of 2019" has the same meaning as The Waltham Forest (Charged For Parking Places) Order 2019;

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order;

"table" means a table set out in a Schedule to this Order;

"Traffic Marshal" means a person appointed by Leyton Orient Football Club to control, manage and maintain traffic signs with regards to the Leyton Orient Football Club's Pedestrian and Cycle Zone on an Event Day.

"traffic sign" or "traffic signs" means a sign of any size, type and colour prescribed and authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

(2) The reference in Article 3(3) of this Order to "diagram 618.3C" shall be construed as a reference to the sign diagram in Item 2 of the sign table set out in Part 2 of Schedule 8 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016, provided that if this sign diagram is revoked and re-enacted by a subsequent enactment then reference to it in this Order shall be construed as a reference to the corresponding diagram number re-enacted by that subsequent enactment.

Prescribed routes

- 3. (1) Subject to Article 4 and paragraph (3) of this Article, no person other than a permit holder shall cause any motor vehicle to enter a pedestrian and cycle zone specified in Schedule 1 during the prescribed hours.
 - (2) Subject to Article 4 and paragraph (3) of this Article, no person shall cause any motor vehicle to enter a pedestrian and cycle zone specified in Schedule 2 during the prescribed hours.
 - (3) The provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article shall apply only at such times during the prescribed hours as shall be indicated by the placing and displaying of a traffic sign or traffic signs of the type shown in diagram 618.3C.

Exemptions

- 4. (1) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply in relation to:-
 - (a) any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police; or
 - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden; or
 - (c) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or.
 - (d) A pedal cycle.
 - (2) Nothing in Article 3(1) and (2) of this Order shall apply in relation to anything done with the written permission of the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest or its representative, provided that any conditions or requirements they may impose are being complied with.
 - (3) The Event Day Commander or Traffic Marshal may direct that, from time to time within the prescribed hours and when safe to do so, nothing in: paragraph (1) and (2) of Article 3 shall apply in relation to:-
 - (a) a bus; or

- (b) a permit holder's vehicle; or
- (c) a vehicle requiring access to premises, located within either: that part of Buckingham Road south west of the south west kerb line of Brisbane Road or within a prescribed street only accessible therefrom; or
- (d) any other vehicle proceeding with the authorisation of the Event Day Commander or traffic marshal. Provided that nothing in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article shall permit a vehicle to enter into or proceed in a prescribed street during the prescribed hours where the Event Day Commander or Traffic Marshal has directed that no vehicle may do so.

Revocation

5. (1) Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order the Waltham Forest (Pedestrian and Cycle Zone) (Event Days) (Prescribed Routes) (No. 1) Experimental Traffic Order 2022(a) is hereby revoked in its entirety.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order prohibits all motor vehicles except permit holders from entering pedestrian and cycle zones in certain streets (permit holders will not be able to access Brisbane Road) in the vicinity of the Leyton Orient Football Stadium during certain time periods during event days only, in the London Borough of Waltham Forest on a permanent basis.

The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (Windsor Road E10) (No.1) Traffic Order 2023

Made 11th December 2023

Coming into operation see Article 1.1

The Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(**a**), as amended and all other powers enabling, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. Citation and Commencement

- 1.1 This Order shall come into operation for the purposes of all the provisions of this Order on 11th December 2023 and may be cited as The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (Windsor Road E10) (No. 1) Traffic Order 2023;
- 1.2 In this Order "pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(**b**);
- 1.3 "footway" has the same meaning as is mentioned in section 329 of the Highways Act 1980(c);
- 1.4 "motor vehicle" has the same meaning as is mentioned in section 136(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; and
- 1.5 "road" in this Order means a "carriageway" as defined in section 329 of the Highways Act 1980.

2. Prescribed Routes

2.1 Subject to Article 3.1, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in Windsor Road E10, between the north-east kerb line of Oliver Road and a point 3.5 metres north-east of that said kerb line.

3. Exemptions

- 3.1 Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply to:
 - (a) any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police; or
 - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden: or
 - (c) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; or
 - (d) a pedal cycle in a road only and not on the footway.

4. Revocations

4.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order the Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (Windsor Road E10) (No. 1) Experimental Traffic Order 2022(a) is hereby revoked in its entirety.

5. Placing of Traffic Signs, etc

The Council shall:

- 5.1 place and maintain adequate and appropriate traffic signs indicating the prescribed routes imposed by this Order; and
- 5.2 carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of such prescribed routes.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order provides a modal filter (prohibition of Motor Vehicles) in Windsor Road E10 at its junction with Oliver Road except pedal cycles, in the London Borough of Waltham Forest on a permanent basis.
