

The Climate Emergency Commission met for the sixth time on Wednesday 5th February to review and challenge the council's current and future approaches to Waste and the Circular Economy, identifying where it can be more ambitious and helping maximise the impact of current and new interventions. The Commission will make recommendations which will enable the Council to better realise its ambitions to tackle climate change and develop a comprehensive, impactful Climate Emergency Strategy. This may include setting targets, identifying opportunity areas, and recommending approaches and mechanisms for better partnership working with residents, local businesses and partners.
