The Waltham Forest (Charged-for Parking Places) (Amendment No. 65) Order 2020

Made: 7th December 2020

Coming into force 7th December 2020

The Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^a, as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Order:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Waltham Forest (Charged-for Parking Places) (Amendment No. 65) Order 202* and shall come into force on 7th December 2020.

Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order:-

“Council” means the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest;

“map schedule legend” means the map schedule legend attached to the Order of 2019 which, when used in conjunction with a map tile, identifies the specific type of parking place designated by Order of 2019 and, where specified, certain of its governing provisions;

“map tile” means an individual map with a specific tile reference, being part of the map based schedule attached to this Order;

“map based schedule” means a map tile attached to this Order and listed in the Schedule to this Order which depicts the parking places designated by the Order of 2019 and, in conjunction with either the map schedule legend or a map tile label, or both, identifies the type of each particular parking place and, where specified, certain of its governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map based schedule and where a parking place is depicted in the map based schedule, that parking place will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data;

“the Order of 2019” means The Waltham Forest (Charged-for Parking Places) Order 2019^b, as amended.

- (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- (3) Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2019 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Substitution of map tiles

3. (1) Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2019 shall have effect as though:
 - (a) for the map tiles attached to that Order and specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order, there were substituted the map tile attached to this Order and specified in relation thereto in column 2 of that Schedule; and
 - (b) for the revision numbers specified in Schedule 2 to the Order of 2019 in relation to the map tiles referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above there were substituted the revision numbers given in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order in relation to the corresponding map tiles.
- (2) The substitution of any map tile referred to in Article 3(1) of this Order will have the effect of revoking or omitting any provision designated or imposed by a previous version of that map tile and not incorporated into the latest version.

Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2019 thereto

4. (1) Each area on a street identified in a map tile as a parking place and, where applicable, by way of either a map tile label or the map schedule legend, or both, as an area marked out and signed for the use therein of specified classes of vehicles following the conditions specified in the Order of 2019 in relation to that type of parking place, is designated as a parking place.
- (2) Unless otherwise so identified, a parking place shall be bounded on one side of its length by the edge of the carriageway and be an area marked either by a traffic sign or by another method of indicating the extent of a parking place as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016^c.
- (3) The provisions of the Order of 2019 (other than Articles 4 and 14) shall apply to each area designated as a parking place by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place included a reference to each area designated as a parking place by this Order.

Placing of traffic signs, etc.

5. The Council shall:-

- (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place referred to in a map tile attached to this Order, and that such parking places may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving of the vehicles specified in Articles 5(1) or 5(1A), as the case may be, of the Order of 2019; and
- (b) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

- a. **Cann Hall Road E11 (CN) - south-east side** – remove a CH permit parking place outside No. 33 CN;
- b. in **Wilmot Road E10 (WL)** – between Nos. 28 and 32 WL CPZ parking space for WR permit holders only operating Mon-Sat 8am to 6.30pm;
- c. in **Winns Avenue E17 (WN)** – for 1.8 metres from a point outside the north-east facing boundary of No. 240 WN north-eastwards CPZ parking space for WA permit holders only operating Mon-Sat 8am to 6.30pm;

in the London Borough of Waltham Forest.

The Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^a, as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Order:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 65) Order 2020 and shall come into force on: 7th December 2020.

Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order:-

“Council” means the Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest;

“map schedule legend” means the map schedule legend attached to the Order of 2019 which, when used in conjunction with a map tile, identifies the specific type of parking place or loading place designated by or waiting restriction or loading restriction provided by this Order and the specific type of parking place and loading place designated by or waiting, loading or stopping restriction provided by the Order of 2019 and, where specified, certain of their governing provisions;

“map tile” means an individual map with a specific tile reference, being part of the map based schedule attached to this Order;

“map based schedule” means a map tile attached to this Order and listed in the Schedule to this Order which depicts the parking places and loading places designated by and the waiting restrictions and loading restrictions provided by this Order and the parking places and loading places designated by and waiting restrictions, loading restrictions and stopping restrictions provided by the Order of 2019 and, in conjunction with either the map schedule legend or a map tile label, or both, identifies the type of each particular parking place or loading place or

length of waiting restrictions, loading restrictions or stopping restrictions, and, where specified, certain of their governing provisions:

Provided that the Council does not accept responsibility for any inaccuracies contained in the Ordnance Survey data relied upon to create the map based schedule and where a parking place, loading place or length of waiting restrictions, loading restrictions or stopping restrictions is depicted in the map based schedule, that parking place, loading place or length of waiting restrictions, loading restrictions or stopping restrictions will continue to apply irrespective of any subsequent changes that have been made to the underlying Ordnance Survey data;

and

“the Order of 2019” means The Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) Consolidation Order 2019^b.

- (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- (3) Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2019 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Substitution of map tiles

3. (1) Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2019 shall have effect as though:
 - (a) for the map tile attached to that Order and specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order, there were substituted the map tile attached to this Order and specified in relation thereto in column 2 of that Schedule; and
 - (b) for the revision numbers specified in Schedule 2 to the Order of 2019 in relation to the map tiles referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above there were substituted the revision numbers given in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order in relation to the corresponding map tiles.
- (2) The substitution of any map tile referred to in Article 3(1) of this Order will have the effect of revoking or omitting any provision provided or designated by a previous version of that map tile and not incorporated into the latest version.

Designation of parking places and loading places and application of the Order of 2019 thereto

4. (1) Each area on a street identified in a map tile as a parking place or, as the case may be, a loading place and, where applicable, by way of either a map tile label or the map schedule legend, or both, as an area marked out and signed for the use therein of specified classes of vehicles following the conditions specified in the Order of 2019 in relation to that type of parking place or loading place, is designated as a parking place or, as the case may be, a loading place.

- (2) Unless otherwise so identified, a parking place or a loading place shall be bounded on one side of its length by the edge of the carriageway and be an area marked either by a traffic sign or by another method of indicating the extent of a parking place or a loading place as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016^c.
- (3) The provisions of the Order of 2019 (other than Articles 4 and 15) shall apply to each area designated as a parking place or a loading place by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place or a loading place included a reference to an area designated as a parking place or a loading place by this Order.

Waiting and loading restrictions applicable in restricted streets

5. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2019 shall have effect as though any waiting restriction or loading restriction identified in a map tile and, where applicable, by way of either a map tile label or the map schedule legend, or both, and marked out and signed as a waiting restriction or a loading restriction, or both, shall be construed as though it were a restricted street referred to in the Order of 2019.

Placing of traffic signs, etc.

6. The Council shall:-
 - (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each parking place, loading place or length of waiting restrictions or length of waiting restrictions or loading restrictions (or both) referred to in a map tile attached to this Order;
 - (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place and loading place described in a map tile attached to this Order traffic signs indicating that such a parking place or loading place may be used during the permitted hours for either: the leaving of the vehicles specified in either Article 5(c) or 5(d), as the case may be, of the Order of 2019, or that such a loading place may be used during the permitted hours for the loading or unloading of the vehicles specified in Article 5(h) of the Order of 2019; and
 - (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place, loading place, length of waiting restrictions or length of loading restrictions.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order further amends the Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) Consolidation Order 2019 so as to:-

- a. in **Cann Hall Road E11 (CN) - south-east side** –outside No. 33 CN double yellow line "at any time" waiting restriction (this will join existing waiting restrictions either side) for visibility and emergency service fire hydrant access;
- b. In **Billet Road E17** double yellow line "at any time" waiting restrictions on the west and south-west side from its junction with the A406 slip Road southwards so that it covers the whole south-west side (extension of existing double yellow lines);
- c. in **Wilmot Road E10 (WL)** –
 - i. removal of the whole double yellow line "at any time" waiting restrictions between Nos. 28 and 32 WL
 - ii. provide double yellow line "at any time" waiting restrictions from a point in line with the north-east facing boundary of No.32 WL north-eastwards for 1.8 metres
- d. in **Winns Avenue E17 (WN)** –
 - i. removal of the single yellow line waiting restriction (except for 1.8 metres from a point outside the north-east facing boundary of No. 240 WN north-eastwards
 - ii. convert single yellow waiting restrictions to double yellow line "at any time" waiting restrictions from a point in line with the north-east facing boundary of No.240 WN north-eastwards for 1.8 metres
- e. in **First Avenue E17 (FA)** convert a loading place and visible double yellow lines to a Restricted Zone (RZ) between the western boundary of No. 1 FA and its south-western extremity

Coming into force see Article 1.1

The Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order:

1. Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.1 This Order shall come into operation for the purposes of all provisions of this Order on x x 2020.
- 1.2 This Order may be cited as The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (No. 2, 1981) (Amendment No. 2) Traffic Order 2020.
- 1.3 "the Order of 1981" means The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (No. 2) Traffic Order 1981.

2. Prescribed Routes

- 2.1 Without prejudice to the validity to anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any Act or any omission before the coming into operation of this Order there was added to the Order of 1981 the following Article:

"4. Nothing in item 4 of the Schedule to this Order shall apply to a pedal cycle"

3. Placing of Traffic Signs, etc

The Council shall:

- 3.1 place and maintain adequate and appropriate traffic signs indicating the prescribed routes imposed by this Order; and
- 3.2 carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of such prescribed routes.

The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (St. Mary Road E17) Traffic Order 2020

Made: 7th December 2020

Coming into force 7th December 2020

The Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984^a, as amended, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Order:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (St. Mary Road E17) Traffic Order 202* and shall come into force on 7th December 2020.

Interpretation

2. (1) In this Order:-
 - causing includes permitting;
 - “footway” has the same meaning as is mentioned in section 329 of the Highways Act 1980(c)
 - “goods vehicle” and “maximum gross weight” have the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016^b;
 - “motor vehicle” has the same meaning as in section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 - road” in this Order means a “carriageway” as defined in section 329 of the Highways Act 1980
 - “traffic sign” has the same meaning as in section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
- (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

Prescribed routes

3. No person shall cause any motor vehicle to enter into or proceed in that part of St. Mary Road E17 which lies between a point 3.5 metres south-west of the common boundary of Nos. 79 and 81 St. Mary Road E17 and its junction with Hoe Street E17, including the footway.

Exemptions

4. Nothing in Article 3 above shall apply in relation to:-
 - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
 - (b) any vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes; or
 - (c) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by a traffic sign placed on the highway pursuant to section 66 or section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order prohibits motor vehicles from entering into or proceeding in the south-westernmost length of St. Mary Road E17, at its junction with Hoe Street E17, in the London Borough of Waltham Forest.
