TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

2020 No. 104

The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (Forest Rising No. 1) Traffic Order 2020

Made 22nd October 2020

Coming into operation – see Article 1

The Council of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order::

1. **Citation and commencement**

1.1 This Order shall come into operation for the purposes of –

- (a) the provisions of Article 3 of this Order from 22nd October 2020;
- (b) the prohibitions mentioned in Article 2 of this Order in so far as any existing prescribed route is revoked, or any new prescribed route imposed, on the date on which it is indicated by either the removal, replacement or installation of traffic signs; and
- (c) all other provisions of this Order on 22nd October 2020.

1.2 This Order may be cited as The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (Forest Rising No. 1) Traffic Order 2020.

2. **Prohibitions**

2.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order:

- (a) no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of road in the London Borough of Waltham Forest specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order in a direction other than that specified in relation to that length of road in column 2 of the said Schedule; and
- (b) no person shall cause any vehicle proceeding in the part of road in the London Borough of Waltham Forest specified in column 1 of Schedule 2 to this Order to

enter the part of road specified in relation to that part of road in column 2 of the said Schedule.

3. Placing of Traffic Signs, etc

The Council shall:

- 3.1 place and maintain adequate and appropriate traffic signs indicating the prescribed routes imposed by this Order; and
- 3.2 carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purpose of the satisfactory operation of such prescribed routes.

4. Exemptions

- 4.1 Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply in relation to:-
 - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden;
 - (b) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; or
 - (c) a pedal cycle.

5. Revocation

- 5.1 Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order The Waltham Forest (Prescribed Routes) (Forest Rising No. 1) Experimental Traffic Order 2019(a) is revoked in its entirety.

SCHEDULE 1 (see Article 2.1(a))

1 Length of road	2 Direction
1. Forest Rise E17 (arm east of Woodford New Road)	from north-east to south-west
2. The Forest E11 between the northern kerb line of Buxton Drive and Oakhurst Gardens	from south-east to north-west

SCHEDULE 2 (see Article 2.1(b))

1 Part of road	2 Part of road
1. Woodford New Road	1. Forest Rise E17 (arm east of Woodford New Road)
2. Oakhurst Gardens E17	2. The Forest E11
3. Oakhurst Gardens E17 - between its junction with Woodford New Road and a point 12 metres south-west of the westernmost entry/exit gate (western edge of gate) to Forest School	3. Oakhurst Gardens E17 - from a point 12 metres south-west of the westernmost entry/exit gate (western edge of gate) to Forest School

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order continues the provisions of one-way operation in various roads in the Forest Rising region and a ban on entering those roads where a no-entry sign plate is displayed, all on a permanent basis, in the London Borough of Waltham Forest.
