- ❖ Addressed local processes for the relocation of young people and families
- ❖ Brought together offending and missing education for Youth and Family Resilience Service
- ❖ Implemented the LifeSkills programme in Primary Schools
- ❖ Established specialisms to respond to emerging behaviours in young people in prison and the community as they exit criminality
- ❖ Addressed concerns around organised criminal activity through the Community Mentoring Programme for young people
- ❖ Developed a data approach to provide a live, child-level 'single view' of a range of risks
- ❖ Built a cross-agency network of Safeguarding Adolescents Leads
- ❖ Delivered VAWG Whole School Approach project
- ❖ Started review of alternative provision
- ❖ Engaged with schools around persistence absence and behaviour strategies

What difference has this made to our children and young people?



- ❖ Improved the collective response to adolescent safeguarding
- ❖ Children/young people receive earlier intervention gaps in services addressed
- ❖ Front-line practitioners identify and understand risks and make informed assessments and decisions
- ❖ Violence against women & girls is viewed in the context of the overall wellbeing of all young people, including boys
- ❖ Children persistently absent and subject to exclusions are better supported
- ❖ Increased awareness for all of safeguarding processes and support available
- ❖ Clarity for parents who choose to educate their children at home
- ❖ Appropriate safeguarding measures in place for schools and early years
- ❖ Young people feel safe in and around school because of improved relationships between them / police / schools
- ❖ Increased confidence in the sports settings being used
